Message from the Mayor



What a massive two weeks we have had since my last community update. The State elections were held over the weekend, with Shooters, Fishers and Farmers candidate Helen Dalton being elected.

I would like to take the opportunity to congratulate Ms Dalton and look forward to working with her for the betterment of our region.

I would also like to thank outgoing member Austin Evans for his hard work on behalf of the electorate over the past 17 months.

Without Austin’s work, Griffith wouldn’t be in the positive position it is now. He helped us achieve a host of fantastic results such as \$224 million

redevelopment of the Griffith Base Hospital, \$3.65 million for a brand-new Griffith Community Centre and \$10 million funding for our Regional Sports Precinct.

Earlier this week Griffith City Council hosted a civic reception to welcome our local school leaders. Every school in the LGA attended with each School Captain and Vice Captain being presented with a Griffith City Council commemorative pin. Congratulations to our future leaders. Thank you to the Principals and students for taking the time out of their day to attend.

Earlier this week the Australian and NSW governments notified

Council that each have committed up to \$202,500 to the \$405,000 Kidman Way (McGann & Jack McWilliam Rds) project, which will see these roads being upgraded. This is great news for road users in our region.

In coming months upgrading will start on the intersection with McGann and Jack McWilliam roads, which will deliver improved turning treatments, widened lanes, drainage improvements and utility adjustments.

This is a really busy thoroughfare, delivering stock, freight and people into and out of the city, at last count around 5,000 vehicles use the intersection daily, of which 15 per cent were heavy

vehicles. While it seems the work is never ending in this area, these improvements will see a much smoother traffic flow, as well as greater safety for the wide mix of traffic accessing busy processing and manufacturing sites, as well as the busy winery.

Griffith Regional Art Gallery officially opened the David Griggs exhibition, Between Nature and Sin last week and I was happy to be able to attend and open this fascinating series. I would encourage you to take some time to visit the Gallery and take in these works. The exhibition is open until Sunday 21 April 2019.

This weekend will see the Rotary District 9700 Conference held in

Griffith, bringing with it more than 300 delegates to the area.

The conference brings together Rotary members to learn more about what is happening in the district and meet other Rotarians in the area. I have the honour of opening the conference and look forward to meeting with Rotarians.

Griffith City Library to host The Wide Angle Film Festival

The 11th Wide Angle Film Festival (formerly Access All Areas Film Festival) will be heading to Griffith on Thursday 2 May 2019, bringing five programs of award winning short films reflecting the lived experience of people with disability to venues across the country.

Wide Angle Film Festival Director Jacqueline Cosgrove says, “2018 is a transformative year for the Festival. The rebrand steps away from the segregation of people with disability for cultural and recreational experiences. Access All Areas Film Festival did important work in raising awareness about the need for cinema access for people with disability. Rebooted as

Wide Angle Film Festival, it now brings the perspectives of people with disability to the whole community.”

Councillor Mike Neville, Chair of the Disability Inclusion and Access Committee said Council is excited to be able to host the Public Festival which is inclusive.

“The Wide Angle Film Festival presents films that include animation, live action, drama, comedy and documentary, and audiences will witness people pushing against barriers, confronting their fears, grappling with huge life events and creating exquisite works of art,” said Councillor Neville.

how those living with a disability can achieve anything they set out to.

The 2017/18 tour garnered audiences of 40 000 and further growth is expected in 2018/19 as the Festival extends its reach to SA and ACT in addition to NT, QLD, NSW, VIC and TAS.

“We received quite a lot of feedback last year in regards to the lack of Christmas spirit in our main street,” Cr Zappacosta said.

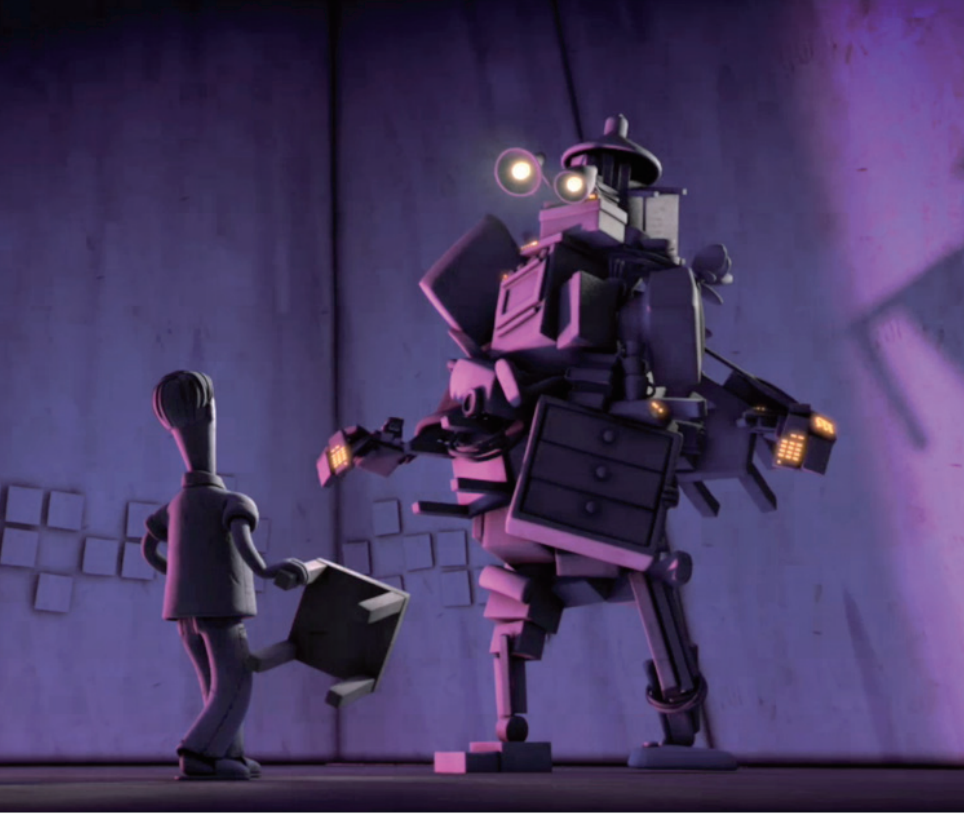
“In the past we’ve had a Christmas committee which was successful in helping add some cheer.

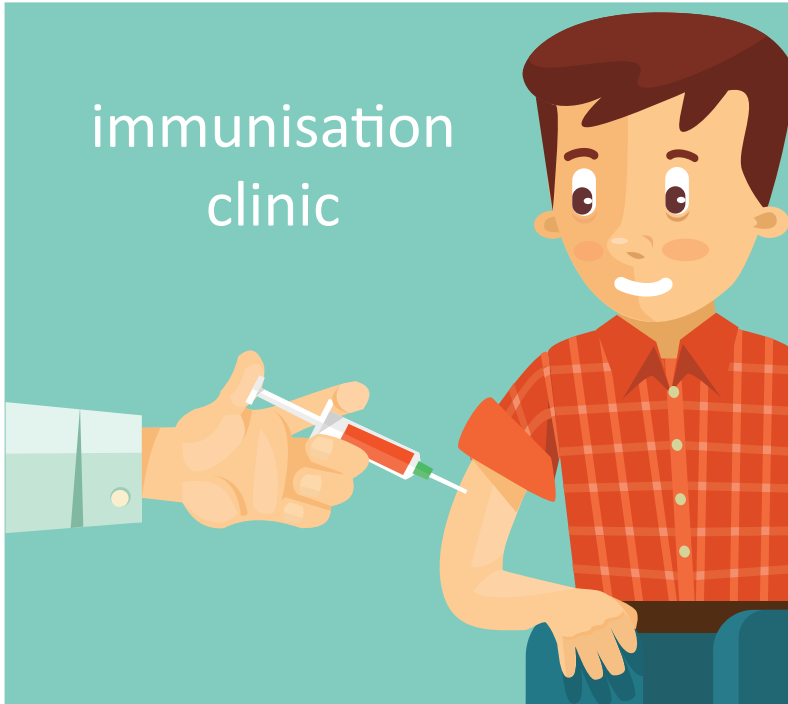

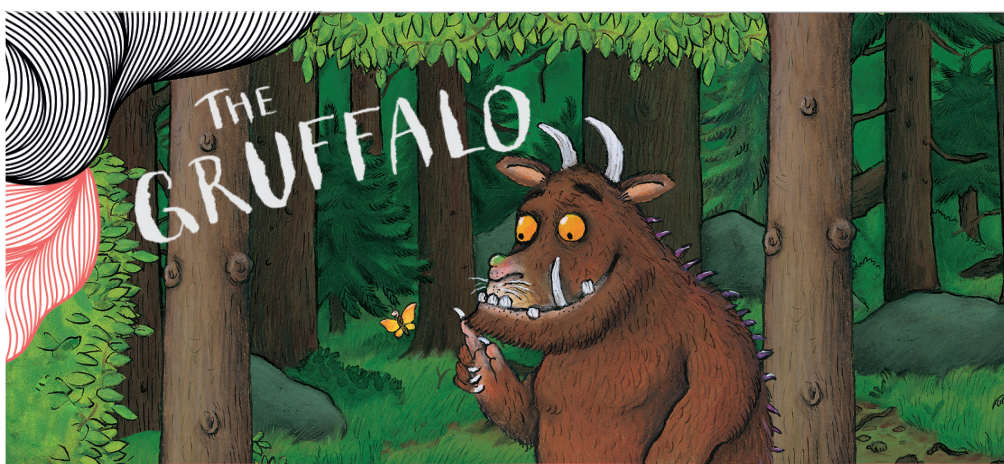
