



Griffith a finalist in NSW Top Tourism Town Awards

Griffith has been named a finalist in the first ever Top Tourism Town Awards for NSW, among 16 towns from across the State in the 5,000 and above category.

"The Top Tourism Town Awards celebrate the unwavering spirit of these communities and demonstrates the true value of tourism and the visitor economy to these towns," said NSW Tourism Industry Council Executive Manager, Greg Binskin.

"It's a real testament to the resilience of these towns that in this first year, we have an incredible 42 finalists in two categories: those with populations over 5,000 residents and those under 5,000.

"These Awards are all about community collaboration, groups such as Tourism Associations and Operators, Councils and Visitor Information Centres have come together to showcase their town as a tourism destination worthy of celebrating."

"The process was highly competitive with inspiring editorial, images and video content accompanied by a compelling 3 – 4 day itinerary essential to be a Top Tourism Town finalist," Mr Binskin said.

Griffith City Council's Tourism Manager, Mirella Guidolin said Griffith's submission was reviewed by a panel of judges which saw us reach the public voting stage.

"Earlier in the week we called everyone who loves Griffith to get voting – this is going to be an extremely competitive award and I am hopeful we will take home the prize," said Ms Guidolin.

"The judges' vote will account for 50%, with the public vote making up the remainder – the public vote could see us win and in turn, attract even more visitors to our great City."

Griffith Mayor, Councillor John Dal Broi said it's a true testament to not only the Tourism Team to make it this far, but to all the Tourism and Hospitality operators.

"Everyone who visits Griffith truly appreciates the unique character and this comes down to what we can offer – which is plenty!" said Councillor Dal Broi.

"Griffith is fortunate to have incredibly passionate and dedicated Tourism and Hospitality operators which ensures visitors have a fantastic time while they visit, with

many opting to extend their stay once they see what is on offer.

"Winning this award would go a long way to showing the rest of Australia what Griffith really is and attract even more visitors to Griffith," added Councillor Dal Broi.

Chair of the Tourism and Events Committee, Councillor Christine Stead said Griffith has seen a surge in regional travellers since Covid, with visitor numbers doubling those prior to the pandemic.

"We have always known Griffith is a great place, but now we are really getting the word out there which is increasing the number of visitors to our area and this adds to our visitor economy – it's a win-win situation for everyone," said Councillor Stead.

"I would like to congratulate the Tourism Team on their entry and look forward to seeing the results at the end of the month."

The winners will be announced by the Hon. Stuart Ayres, Minister for Tourism, Investment & Jobs at the Local Government NSW Destination & Visitor Economy Conference, Thursday 27 May 2021.

Kooyoo Street transformed for Street Scapes Griffith Festival



Kooyoo Street has taken on a whole new look and feel throughout Street Scapes, particularly at night when a series of animations take centre stage.

Council's Project Planner, Mr Nathan Beer, said when concepts were being discussed for the festival, the team wanted to ensure the street was brought to life through accenting the turn of the century architecture throughout Griffith.

"Early on in the discussions it was decided to use projections to not only engage with the community, but to highlight the buildings in the CBD - in utilising Kooyoo Street, we selected the Westpac building which is a great example of early rural colonial architecture," said Mr Beer.

"Working with regional animators from Wagga Wagga, we hope to be able to capture the rural character and unique lives and translate this into dynamic and engaging artworks."

Alice Peacock Animation & Motion Design was contracted to create a series of animations which will be projected throughout Kooyoo Street for the duration of Street Scapes.

"This project was particularly important in that we have an opportunity to contribute to and support a thriving arts ecosystem," said Ms Peacock.

"The projections were created by a collective of regionally based photographers, animators, illustrators, film makers, sound designers and sculptors who all share a common interest in the way in which the respond to place," said Ms Peacock.

Council has invested in the projection equipment which will enable Council and partners to

deploy showstopping projections, outdoor cinemas, artworks and events into the future.

"Street Scapes is all about place activation and these projections will transform the once bland Kooyoo Street environment into a vivid and exciting space for all to enjoy," said Mr Beer.

"This pilot program is just the first event of many and plan to use the equipment to empower our local technicians and event organisers to host world class events, driving tourism and letting people know there is more to Griffith than meets the eye."

Griffith Mayor Councillor John Dal Broi said he is thrilled Council can not only host events such as this, but also provide the facilities to encourage other operators to step out of the box and create their own events into the future.

"Griffith has experienced high visitor numbers over the last few years, and we feel by providing the resources we can partner with other businesses to take advantage of that momentum," he said.

Kooyoo Street will host a series of events throughout May, including community art, workshops with Dizzy Dilemma, dance sessions with Griffith Performing Arts Centre, and a range of other events and activities.

Take some time to enjoy a catch up each with family or friends each lunch time over the next few weeks when a different local cater or restaurateur will be selling lunch in Kooyoo Street from 11am - 3pm. The Kooyoo Street projection art launched 8 May and will continue through until Saturday 29 May.

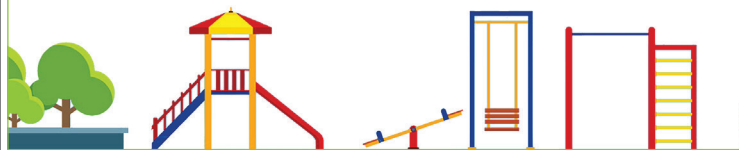
Wood Park Redevelopment

Community Grant recipients awarded

Round 2 of Council's 2020/21 Community Grants Program will help 12 local groups deliver a diverse range of community based initiatives.

At the Ordinary Council Meeting on Tuesday Council endorsed awarding a total of \$31,500.

Chair of the Communities Committee, Councillor Dino Zappacosta said the Community Grant Program gives local organisations and individuals the chance to receive funds to support new projects or initiatives that assist the community.

Opera Australia's 25th anniversary launches with Bizet's 'Carmen'



Celebrating the 25th anniversary of its national touring Program, Opera Australia is making its way to Griffith with a new production of Bizet's Carmen by director Matthew Barclay.

For the last 25 years Opera Australia has presented more than 655 fully-staged performances in 117 different locations, and covered more than 305,000kms.

Set to perform at Griffith Regional Theatre on Saturday 5 June at 7.30pm, the production includes a travelling troupe of 32 people including cast, crew, and a chamber orchestra.

Opera Australia's Artistic Director Lyndon Terracini firmly believes that opera resonates just as strongly with audiences outside the major cities.

"We've had such a terrific response over the years, and in fact reaching this 25 year milestone is testament to the level of support this tour attracts right across the country. Touring creates an opportunity for Australians to experience the traditional artform, often for the first time, performed by excellent singers and musicians" he said.

Director Matthew Barclay is honoured to have been asked to direct this 25th anniversary tour.

"I'm really excited to create this production of Carmen, and aware that for some people it may be their first encounter with Bizet's opera, and for that reason I really hope the production enables them to fall in love with the work.

"Carmen really has it all, some

of opera's greatest music and most famous tunes, Spanish flair, passion, tragedy and a truly enigmatic character in Carmen, but above all it's about love. It's the ideal way to showcase world-class opera on stages around Australia," said Matthew.

Set in Seville in Franco's socially conservative 1960's Spain, the opera follows the ill-fated relationship of a free spirited gypsy woman, Carmen, and the passionate and ultimately destructive police corporal-turned-rebel Don Jose.

Acting Manager of Griffith Regional Theatre, Marg Andreazza, said it is so wonderful to have Opera Australia as part of our season and to bring them to Griffith.

"They will put on an amazing show - the stage aesthetic and costumes will be so immersive the audience will be taken to Spain!" she said.

"The audience might be familiar with the famous Habanera or the Toreador songs, but some might not realise that they come from Bizet's Carmen - now they have a chance to see it performed, just as Bizet meant – live and loud."

"We are excited to present our first members only event of the year, with a pre-show function before the Opera, and remind our valuable members to RSVP for this event" Mrs Andreazza said.

Non-residential Roll - Council Elections

Non-residents of Griffith City Council are permitted to enrol and vote in the September 2021 local government elections if they meet eligibility criteria and supply the necessary information to Council.

The non-residential rolls provide people who are non-resident owners, occupiers and rate-paying lessees of rateable land within the Council area an opportunity to have a say who is elected to Council.

You must be eligible to vote at Federal or State elections to be on a non-residential roll.

To be on the roll of non-resident owners of rateable land, you must be:

- the sole owner of the rateable land, or
- nominated as the elector by the joint or several owners of the rateable land, or
- nominated as the elector by the corporation or trustees who own the rateable land, or
- the lessee of the land from the Crown and the land is rateable Crown land.

To be on the roll of occupiers and rate-paying lessees, you must be:

- the sole occupier or ratepaying lessee of rateable land, or
- nominated as the elector by the joint or several occupiers or ratepaying lessees of the rateable land, or
- nominated as the elector by the corporation or trustees who occupy or are the ratepaying lessee of the rateable land, and have the legal right to occupy the land, or be responsible for paying all or part of the rates on the land for 3 years following the date you apply to be on the roll.

Applications for Non-Residential rolls are to be completed, addressed to the General Manager, and received by the Griffith City Council by **6pm on 26 July 2021.**
