

Pop-up exhibition set to showcase local talents

The talents of Griffith Regional Art Gallery's vibrant life drawing club will be showcased when the exciting Exposé exhibition pops up. The life drawing club, under the tutelage of Public Programs Officer, Anthea Da Silva, is a longstanding and staple public program for the Gallery. Exposé will open at Griffith Regional Art Gallery on Thursday 31 May at 6pm.

The enthusiastic group meets regularly to take part in dynamic life drawing sessions and the pop-up exhibition will reveal the talent and diversity in styles the group currently possess.

Regional Art Gallery Coordinator, Ray Wholohan, said life drawing has been a fundamental part of fine art education for hundreds of years and he is pleased to see how Griffith is embracing it. "When I first arrived at the Gallery in January 2015, I was very impressed to find such a strong and committed group of life drawers. The group has leapt from strength to strength, especially under Anthea," said Mr Wholohan.

Public Programs Officer, Anthea Da Silva, believes life drawing is suitable for all skill levels.

"The life sessions are for everyone from absolute beginners, occasional dabblers, teachers and professionals itching to get out the charcoal, paint, pencils, clay, textas and sticky bits of electrical tape again," said Ms Da Silva

"A live model will strike dynamic poses for two hours while we share practical drawing tips, erudite art chat, vino and nibbles."

To celebrate the Exposé pop-up exhibition, two public programs have been planned.

The official opening will be held on Thursday 31 May at 6pm with plenty of chilled and bubbly Brut Cuvée provided by sponsors McWilliam's Family Winemakers. A free life drawing session is also being held for any new or interested people on Saturday 2 June at 3pm with vino and nibbles also included. If you have always been interested in life drawing but would like to 'try before you buy' the free session is for you. Bookings are essential with materials provided.

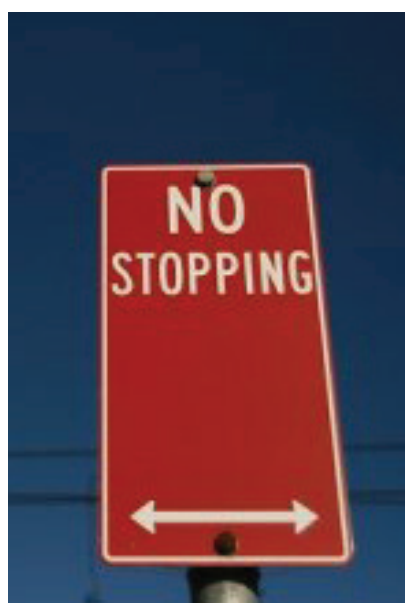
Road safety around schools
