News in Brief - Council projects

Enticknap Park
Council is pleased to advise Enticknap Park was officially opened on Wednesday 21 August. Thank you to those who braved the weather conditions to help celebrate the opening of the Park. The all abilities playground is located in East Griffith bordered by Langley Crescent, Grey Street and Murphy Crescent and features a brand new state-of-the-art wheelchair accessible barbecue and picnic shelter, a huge 25m flying fox, 4m high climbing pyramid, sensory zone, basket swing, and a fully wheel chair accessible spinner and sand digger.

Memorial Park
Work on the Stage 1 Memorial Park Upgrade is nearing completion with the amenities block scheduled to open Monday 26 August. Work on the stage is progressing well and should be finalised over the next week, however the temporary fencing will remain in place until the pavement works have concluded. The stage is scheduled to be finalised on 9 September, just in time for the warmer weather!

Jubilee Oval
Construction is well under way on the 4 lane Cricket Net Complex at Jubilee Oval, with thanks to funding secured from the NSW ICC T20 World Cup 2020 Cricket Legacy Fund and Griffith City Council. The project is a joint initiative between Griffith Cricket Association and Griffith City Council and will see Jubilee Oval become a training hub for Representative and Junior Cricket, taking some of the pressure off other facilities across the area and freeing them up for club cricket training. The \$130,000 project (funded 50/50 with Council and the Cricket Legacy Fund) will also see the existing synthetic wicket resurfaced, as well as the construction of a new synthetic wicket. The local cricket community has joined forces with the Association and Council and will carry out a series of working bees over the coming weeks to ensure the funding goes as far as possible. It is anticipated that construction will be

completed in the coming weeks.

Griffith Sports Precinct - Griffith Regional Aquatic Leisure Centre
Work is underway on the \$24.8M Sports Precinct for our region, with thanks to funding of \$10M from the Regional Sports Infrastructure Fund (NSW Government), \$4.5M from the Building Better Regions Fund (Commonwealth Government) and \$10.3M from Griffith City Council. A consultation session was held with Griffith Swim Club and Griffith Sports Council recently, where the plans for GRALC were discussed. Further community consultation will be taking place in the coming months with all members of the public encouraged to have their say on this important project. The GRALC portion of the Sport Precinct will see the construction of a 50m outdoor swimming pool, new changerooms and toilets, accessibility ramp into the pool, and a new pump room to accommodate the needs of all the new pool at an estimated cost of approximately \$6M. Council has called for tenders for a Project Management Team to oversee the entire Regional Sports Precinct Project and hope to have appointed a Project Manager in the coming weeks. Following that process, tenders will be called for a Detailed Design & Construct of the GRALC component. It is anticipated that this will be finalised by early 2020, and construction on the GRALC 50m pool to commence in the first half of 2020.

Stronger Country Communities Fund
Don’t forget to place your vote or nominate a project for the Stronger Country Communities Fund. A total of \$869,139 has been allocated to the Griffith City Local Government Area with funding to be allocated to projects that clearly demonstrate community support. This fund also has a focus on projects that will improve the lives of young people (12-24 years old), with 50% of funding being allocated to these types of projects; however other projects will also be considered.
