Griffith in Top Ten Affordable Regions across Australia

The Griffith Local Government Area (LGA) 20 per cent. has been named one of Australia's Top Ten 2. Property trends – the LGA considered must Affordable Regions in an article from Smart Property Investment last week.

PRD Chief Economist Dr Diaswait Mardiasmo delved into Australia's suburbs to find the "top 10 regional affordable areas 2022", based on five selection criteria.

Griffith came in at number 6, alongside Whitsunday (QLD), Mackay Toowoomba (QLD), Upper Hunter (NSW), Wagga Wagga (NSW), Northern Grampians (VIC), Wodonga (VIC), Greater Bendigo (VIC), and Central Highlands (TAS).

Dr Mardiasmo called these locations "roaring regions", considering them as affordable alternative areas with solid fundamentals for future growth.

According to Dr Mardiasmo, regional areas are leading the way when it comes to affordability and liveability, while the Australian dream of property ownership still exists. She also acknowledged that regional areas became the most attractive option in 2021, with buyers "capitalising on lower median property prices and utilising flexible remote working conditions introduced amidst COVID-19".

Dr Mardiasmo used the following five selection criteria to name the top ten:

1. Affordability – that the local government area (LGA) has a median house price below the calculated maximum affordable property

have had 20 or more transactions take place in 2020 and 2021 and have witnessed positive median house price growth over those two

3. Investment – the LGA must have showcased on-par or higher rental yield than its corresponding capital city, as well as an on-par or lower vacancy rate compared to its city.

4. Project development – the LGA has a high estimated value of future project development, inclusive of a higher concentration of commercial and infrastructure projects, hence ensuring a positive economic outlook.

5. Unemployment rate – the LGA should have an on-par or lower unemployment rate than the state average, as of the September quarter 2021, to ensure there is local job growth.

In all of these areas, recorded median house prices remain below \$550,000 - well below the weighted average Australian median house price of \$1.02 million.

Griffith Mayor, Councillor Doug Curran welcomed the findings, saying Dr Mardiasmo's research confirmed what he already knew -Griffith is booming!

"Our LGA has been experiencing continued growth for some time now, a fact which we are very proud of as a Council," said Councillor

"Dr Mardiasmo has conducted a very sale price. This is the state average loan, plus thorough study and I am pleased to see

Griffith meets all of the five criteria - our housing is affordable, our real estate market is strong, the rental market and investment properties are in demand, we have a higher than average number of property, commercial and infrastructure projects underway, and our LGA boasts a low unemployment rate – all in all, we are in a very strong economic position. "We are committed to seeing Griffith prosper and thrive now and into the future and this study demonstrates that we are on the right track," added Councillor Curran.

Councillor Curran said Griffith really is the envy of our region, if not the State, and Dr Mardiasmo's findings are proof of that.

"You don't have to look far to see a project, an investment opportunity or a new business thriving - Griffith continues to grow and develop the local economy despite the external challenges and I know many LGAs would be excited to be experiencing the level of opportunity we are," he said.

The demand for housing is high in Griffith thanks to a strong economy and high employment rates, however affordable housing demand outweighs the current availability. Council has developed a Housing Strategy to address the gap, and is currently working with Argyle Housing and the Australian Government on the \$12M Griffith Green Affordable Housing Project which will see approximately 42 affordable housing blocks and 20 townhouses constructed.

The Griffith Easter Party saw Griffith a hive of activity last weekend, with events and activities for everyone to enjoy.

Griffith Mayor, Councillor Doug Curran, said this Easter in Griffith was fantastic and the great weather was the cherry on top.

Mango at Griffith Regional Theatre and many seafood frenzies and raffles at the local clubs on Thursday night which were well attended. The weekend also featured the Bacchus Fun Run/Walk out at Lake Wyangan and Pioneer Park Action Day on Good Friday.

Banna Avenue was bustling on Easter Saturday with the Sidewalk Sale and Children's Brunch, while the afternoon had the hugely successful Craft Beer Festival - Blood Sweat & Beers which sold out in its first year, as did the ever popular Riverina Winemakers event Griffith Vintage Festival.

All winery cellar door and event numbers were in abundance over Saturday and Sunday with Berton Vineyards, Calabria Family Wines, De Bortoli Wines and Yarran Wines each hosting events. The first producer and artisan market stall held at Piccolo Family Farm was a huge success with locals and visitors alike catching a glimpse of their new Visitor Experience Cellar Door

Local cafes, restaurants and clubs were overflowing and local retailers acknowledged a large increase in visitors, with everyone enjoying shopping and local delicacies.

Councillor Curran thanked the local operators for their participation in the Griffith Easter Party program and campaign.

"Without operators, business and retailers supporting the Easter Party by staying open and hosting events, the weekend would not have been nearly as successful – we simply could not do this without their commitment and dedication to showcasing Griffith," said Councillor Curran.

"I would also like to extend my gratitude to the many volunteers and staff who gave up time with their families to assist at many of these events over the weekend."

Ms Guidolin said she was pleased the marketing campaign was so successful and found many visitors were well informed before they arrived, having already booked their tickets to many events on offer and had even pre booked their breakfast lunch and dinner reservations.

Locals create fitting tribute to the Anzacs



Anzac Day, 25 April, is a day of national remembrance. It marks the anniversary of the first major military action fought by Australian and New Zealand forces during the First World War.

Locals, Angelo and Diana Dal Broi have transformed their yard into a beautiful tribute for Anzac Day, in an effort to educate young people on what our forefathers went through.

Mr Dal Broi said he and his wife wanted to do something to draw attention to the sacrifices made by those in the Armed Services.

"My wife and I are at an age where we remember what our parents and grandparents went through in the war, the sacrifices made, the lives lost, all so that we can have the freedoms we enjoy today," said Mr Dal Broi.

"I would like to see young people take a moment to consider what happened during war time, to understand what soldiers went through in order to provide the life we have. We felt that at times their sacrifices are forgotten and we wanted to do something to start that conversation - and this display is how we decided to do it."

Works underway on Barber Road



Griffith City Council has commenced the upgrading and sealing of Barber Road, extending 6.6km south of Brogden Road. with the project being delivered in two stages, Stage A and Stage B.

Stage A is between Brogden Road and Australian Grain Link access way and Stage B is a small portion between Australian Grain Link access way to the MI bridge over the supply channel.

The project is funded under NSW Fixing Local Roads Program, Roads to Recovery Program, Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program and also a contribution from local farmers & Australian Grain Link Pty Ltd.

Council's Works Manager Construction, Mr Shree Shrestha said Stage Α construction commenced Monday 4 April 2022, with the closure of section of Barber Road between Brogden Road and Australian Grain Link Access.

"Work is scheduled to be completed by November 2022, weather permitting with Stage B planned to commence during November 2022 following the completion of Stage A," said Mr Shrestha.

Stage B will see the closure of the section of Barber Road between Australian Grain Link Access and Twaddell Road and is scheduled to be completed by January 2023, weather permitting."

Drew Road (from Barber Road to Woodside Road) and Bayley Lane

will also be closed during the duration of construction works. Local residents and local businesses are advised to use alternate access during the construction period.

The detours for the closure of Barber Road will consist of:

• Stage A & B - Detour - Brogden Rd, Bringagee Road and Twaddell

During the Stage B, Stage A portion of the road will be partially open for local traffic only.

The construction work will be facilitated typically between the hours of 6:30am - 5:00pm Monday to Friday with no works to occur on Sunday or public holidays.

In rare cases, works will be done on Saturday.

Preliminary works like vegetation removal and potholing were undertaken without a road closure. The scope of works includes but is not limited to drainage, relocation of utilities, pavement construction and sealing.

Griffith Mayor, Councillor Doug Curran said he is pleased to see the works underway.

"Council is committed to seeking funding for our road network to complete projects such as Barber Road," said Councillor Curran.

"This project demonstrates what can happen when Government, enterprise and stakeholders come together for common goal."

During the construction period, the affected local residents are requested to drive cautiously.




