Griffith hosting The Daily Telegraph Bush Summit this August



Griffith will shine on 27 August when Griffith City Council hosts the "2021 Daily Telegraph Bush Summit", with Prime Minister Scott Morrison and NSW Premier, Gladys Berejiklian in attendance.

Council is working closely with organisers on the agenda providing a rare opportunity to discuss matters important to our community such as Housing, Water, Investment, Agriculture, Export and the drought.

Griffith Mayor John Dal Broi said as host city of the event, Griffith was set to benefit in a range of ways.

"The publicity and exposure that an event such as this gives our City is invaluable. This one day summit showcases the opportunities for businesses and families to realise their potential by moving to a rural or regional centre like ours," said Councillor Dal Broi.

"This will be a golden opportunity to share with our political leaders exactly what issues we are facing, and to showcase our large export industry to a wide audience – this is not just a coup for Griffith, but the surrounding and outlying Local Government Areas."

Housing Minister, Melinda Pavey will be in attendance giving Council a rare opportunity to speak frankly about the housing crisis, which is a challenge being faced by most regional centres in Australia.

"Council has been working toward finding solutions for the housing issues, including developing the 2019 Housing Strategy and the \$12M partnership with the State and Argyle Housing to provide 20 affordable housing dwellings and 42 build ready lots for new homes," said Councillor Dal Broi.

"Being able to meet with Ms Pavey in person gives us an opportunity to discuss the need for not only affordable housing, but more social housing projects to help address the increasing housing crisis we face."

The inaugural summit was held in Dubbo in 2019, with Cooma hosting the 2020 event. Numerous political leaders presented at last year's event including the Prime Minister, Leader of the Opposition, the Premier, and several Ministers both State and Federal, with several business leaders presenting.

driveways and footpaths on the northern side of Stage 3 of the Ymail Street Upgrade has commenced and is progressing well.

Businesses are being individually consulted as works near shop entrances to ensure minimal disruption to their operation. Adjustment of various Telstra pits has also been occurring over the last few weeks to ensure uniformity of levels in the new footpath.

During these works, pedestrian access to businesses remains a priority with temporary paths set

construction of ramps, up to detour foot traffic when required.

Merrigal Street Bridge installation nearing completion

Funding made available through the Australian Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program has provided for the construction of a pedestrian and cyclist bridge over the canal on the southern side of Merrigal Street between Noorla Street and Kywong Street.

Engineering completed manufacturing and placement of the bridge for Griffith City Council which will provide connectivity between future Westend Stadium and Jubilee Oval. In the future this will allow the Sports Precincts to be linked together in a safe way.

Griffith Mayor, Councillor John Dal Broi said with the creation of the redevelopment of the Westend

Sports Facility, it is expected that pedestrian and cyclist traffic will increase. "Connection from our sporting facilities will be increasingly important with the current works, and providing safe commuter access is paramount," said Councillor Dal Broi

"This new structure is specifically targeted to provide access for pedestrians and cyclists Merrigal Street crossing the canal safely."

The bridge has a 2.5m walkway and will separates pedestrians and cyclists from traffic. The bridge should be open by September 2021, weather permitting, with the completion of bridge approaches and safety barriers in the next two months.

Notice is hereby given under the Roads Act 1993, Section 122 for the temporary closing of :

Palla Street between Wyangan Avenue and Kooringal Avenue, Kooringal Avenue between Cutler Avenue and Animoo Avenue and Binya Street between Kooringal Avenue and Anzac Street will be closed on Sunday 18 July 2021 from 8am until 3pm for the replacement of a condemned power pole by Essential Energy. Detours around the site will be provided. The Southern lane of Palla Street will be manned at the closures and left open at the roundabout to provide access to heavy vehicles and emergency services.

Campbell Street between Goondooloo Street and Cutler Avenue to southbound traffic will continue until Tuesday 20 July 2021 from 6am until 5:30pm. Campbell Street will only be closed when machinery and workers are required to work within 1.2m of the traffic lane. Road will be closed for the period detour signs are in place.

Hoad Street between Sanders Street and Webster Street will be closed on Tuesday 20 July 2021 from 9am until 11am for the replacement of a padmount transformer by Essential Energy. Detours around the site and access for residents will be provided.

Yarran Lane between School Street and Yarran Street will be closed on Wednesday 21 July 2021 from 8am until 1pm as Essential Energy will be stringing conductors and changing poles. School buses will be given priority and access for residents will be provided.

Crawford Road between Kidman Way and Millis Road will be closed from Monday 19 July until Saturday 24 July 2021 between 8am until 3pm for the backfilling of a culvert by Murrumbidgee Irrigation. Detours around the worksite will be provided.
