### At A Glance: Find accessible Griffith Businesses

Finding accessible businesses in Griffith will be made easier over the coming months with the Access At A Glance program being delivered in the city.

The program launch coincides with the annual observance of the International Day of People with Disability (IDPWD) on December 3 — a day to promote an understanding of disability issues and mobilise support for the dignity, rights and well-being of people with disability.

Intereach is partnering with Griffith City Council, and with the support of the Griffith Business Chamber, is assessing businesses on how accessible and inclusive they are. Access At A Glance focuses on how businesses are currently meeting disability access and inclusion and provides advice on improvements to lift the experience of all customers.

The outcome of that accessibility review can be highlighted with a number of stickers which allow people, at a glance, to make an assessment if they will have access and support in that business.

Intereach Acting CEO Yvette Buhagiar said Access At A Glance was a free service and an opportunity for businesses to have a conversation with Griffith Intereach team to look at ways of gaining a greater

understanding of how small changes can make a huge difference when it comes to access and inclusion.

Being an inclusive business benefits everyone, not just people with disability. This includes people with prams, temporary injuries and older people.

"We would welcome the opportunity to have a conversation with local businesses. In being an inclusive business it simply means providing products and services in a way that ensures people of all abilities are welcome and treated with equity and dignity," Ms Buhagiar said.

"With the Business Chamber and Council being so supportive, we can see that Griffith wants to be a leader in this space, we really appreciate their support in this partnership."

A number of local businesses have already registered for an assessment, which will ramp up in 2023. They include the Country Universities Centre Western Riverina, Cater & Blumer Solicitors, Griffith Tourism Hub and PinnacleHPC Accountants.

Griffith City Council Mayor Doug Curran said the program was an opportunity for all businesses to get involved.

"We welcome this partnership and the support that Access At A Glance has already received, but I would encourage all businesses to think about accessibility and get involved," Mayor Curran said.

"Council has a well-regarded Disability Inclusion and Access Committee that is supported by Councillor Shari Blumer (Chair) and Councillor Laurie Testoni. They are always advocating for improvements across our region.

"Importantly, we have committee members who can share their lived experience which is crucial when it comes to support and decision-making."

Inclusion benefits us all, however, can be particularly beneficial for:

- People with physical disability e.g. people who use wheelchairs, mobility aids such as mobility scooters, walking frames or crutches
- People with vision or hearing impairment
- Carers of people with disability
- People with prams and strollers
- People with a learning difficulty, intellectual disability or brain injury
- People who are frail.

# Griffin Green Housing Project recocognised



Argyle Housing and Griffith City Council's Griffin Green Project was recognised at the PowerHousing Australia Awards Ceremony last week, being named the runner up of the 2022 Business Partner Award.

The 2022 **PowerHousing** Academy Scholarships and National Awards are designed to showcase the individuals and teams in their membership who have gone above and beyond to support their colleagues and clients during these unprecedented times. The Awards acknowledge the sector and the community at large, as well as highlighting the difference that PowerHousing members make to the lives of residents, local communities and our nation.

The \$12M Affordable Housing Project, Griffin Green will see 20 townhouses and more than 42 housing lots built around Dave Taylor Park, to help address the housing shortage and provide affordable housing options and a way to enter the competitive home ownership market in Griffith.

Griffin Green has been funded by the Australian Government's Building Better Regions Fund (\$6M), Griffith City Council (\$3M), and Argyle Housing (\$3M).

Council and Argyle Housing have committed to providing residents with new playground equipment, a basketball court, and a large open green space within Dave Taylor Park with consultation sessions being held over the last couple of months, and a new Community Hub will also be constructed by

Argyle Housing.

Carolyn Doherty, Argyle Housing CEO said Argyle Housing are excited to achieve this recognition in our partnership with Griffith City Council.

"We are very grateful to Powerhousing Australia for the recognition of our business relationship with Griffith City Council on the Griffin Green Housing Project," said Ms Doherty.

"Together we are revitalising a community through building 20 medium density affordable rental homes and 42 housing lots in South Griffith."

Griffith Mayor, Councillor Doug Curran said he is pleased to see this unique partnership and project receive acknowledgment at the awards ceremony.

"This partnership with the Australian Government and Argyle Housing is just one demonstration of working with Government and Non-Government Organisations to address the needs of our community," said Councillor Curran.

"This development not only reflects the innovation that can be achieved in regional areas through partnerships but demonstrates the importance and impact of the investment into housing and economic outcomes in areas of regional growth."

Construction of the 20 townhouses is currently underway with framework being erected. Due to the recent rain events and subsequent delays, construction is due to be completed by August 2023.

With a strong network of community, school and sporting contacts locally, regionally and nationally, Mr Jenkins hopes to work closely with organisations to bring GRSC to a level that provides all users with a positive experience.

"I am really excited to be joining the team at GRSC and I look forward to supporting local sporting organisations to showcase their players, parents, supporters and sponsors to a high level and host regional sporting events into the future," said Mr Jenkins.

"I have previously worked as a NSW Development Manager with AFL NSW/ACT for 11 years, and I understand the role organised sport plays in connecting the community – there are so many benefits to sport not limited to physical outcomes, but mentally and socially.

"The GRSC has a range of facilities offering a vast array of sports for our community – I welcome you to come down and explore the Centre and try one of our many activities," he added.

Mr Jenkins is proud to call Griffith home, and has deep roots within the community. His wife, Laura is a teacher at Marian Catholic College and they have an 18 month old daughter and twins on the way. "I'm excited to work with all users of the GRSC to help kids, families and teams achieve great things. 

#### **Notice of Temporary Road Closures**

Bromley Road and Butler Road will remain closed until the end of December 2022 for the construction of the remaining section of Bromley Road and extension of Thorne Road between Bromley Road and Walla Avenue, Upgrade of Thorne Road between Walla Avenue and Murrumbidgee Avenue and the construction of roundabout at Thorne Road and Murrumbidgee intersection.
