On Tuesday night at our Council meeting elections were held for deputy mayor and I would like to congratulate Cr Curran on his appointment. I'd also like to take this opportunity to thank former deputy mayor, Councillor Dino Zappacosta for his support over the last two years. This election marks a two year milestone for myself as Mayor and Councillors and it provides a good opportunity to look at some of the achievements the current Council has made in the

first half of its four-year term. As Mayor, I have had the pleasure of seeing the opening of the Bagtown Roundabout, the northern link bypass, our new skate park and the completion of the Village Sewerage Scheme for Tharbogang, Nericon and Lake Wyangan. The second part of this term will see Council continuing work on the Griffith Southern Industrial Link (GSIL), as well as the start of work to upgrade Yambil Street as part of our overall CBD strategy.

I'm happy to say that Council continues to support rate pegging and hopefully our application for the Sport Precinct and 50 metre outdoor pool will come through. We've been successful in attracting grant funding for our theatre and local roads, our villages and Griffith will have new footpaths and work is about to start on the East Mirrool Regulator at Yenda. I'm proud of what we've been able to achieve so far and look forward to the next two years as we continue to

do our very best for the community. On Sunday I've been invited to open the annual Griffith Show and I urge everyone to attend this fantastic family event. Don't forget construction of our Real Juice Company Citrus Sculptures will take place on Sunday, 7 October starting at 7am. Everyone is welcome to join in, the more the merrier. Your help would be appreciated because it takes a big effort to set them up. And lastly, if you are heading away

this long weekend, stay safe on our road and remember to Stop, Revive, Survive.
