Griffith Spring Fest back to celebrate all things Spring this October

After a two-year hiatus Griffith's flagship festival, Griffith Spring Fest is set to return from 9 – 23 October 2022 and will showcase everything Griffith has to offer.

This year will finally see the celebration of 30 years of the Griffith Garden Festival and 25 years of the Citrus Sculptures.

Griffith City Council's Tourism Events Coordinator, Izabella Apolloni said Real Juice Company have come back on board again this year as a major sponsor.

"We have all the favourites plus some new sculptures which will make for a fantastic display, celebrating the 25th Anniversary of the Real Juice Company Citrus Sculptures," she said.

Traditionally, around 800 locals meet in the early hours of Sunday morning to help build around 70 sculptures, which is one of the key components event organisers are working on at the moment.

After two years of cancellations, Miss Apolloni says they are excited to bring back some favourite events such as the De Bortoli Wines Griffith Garden Festival and the popular LINX Launch Party down Banna Avenue.

"We are celebrating the 30th year of the Griffith Garden Festival this year with some new and returning gardens which will be announced soon," said Miss Apolloni.

"De Bortoli Wines have joined us as the major sponsor of the Griffith Garden Festival, and I am excited to announce that gardening guru Costa Georgiadis will be back to help us celebrate - we can't wait to have him back in town!"

Griffith Mayor, Councillor Doug Curran said despite the Covid-19 pandemic cancelling the festival in prior years, it is wonderful to be able to welcome locals and visitors back to celebrate this year.

"The Tourism Team delivered an online

festival in 2020, which celebrated some of our wonderful garden owners, it is exciting that we can now show some of the region's most spectacular gardens in person this year," said Councillor Curran.

"I would encourage you to come out this October to explore them all and support the local charities and groups at each of the gardens."

LINX will again sponsor the LINX Launch Party in the Griffith Visitor Information Centre Car Park, with live music, food, wine, beer and a selection of local stallholders on Friday 14 October from 5.30pm.

Bell Shakespeare presents free workshop and scholarship opportunity for high school students



Renowned national theatre company Bell Shakespeare is offering high schools students the opportunity to take part in a free workshop and the chance to audition for a fully funded scholarship.

Both the Regional Access Workshop and John Bell Scholarship (JBS) audition will take place at the Griffith Regional Theatre on Monday 26 September 2022.

The workshop is open to high school students aged 13 - 18 and will be run by a teaching artist from Bell Shakespeare who will help students to unlock Shakespeare's language and bring it to life via dynamic drama-based strategies.

practical and engaging 75-minute workshop covers plot, character journeys, key scenes, production design and backstage insights to enhance students' understanding of Shakespeare's classic play The Comedy of Errors. Artistic Director Peter Evans states. "Our mission is to make our work available for all Australians, ensuring those who live outside capital cities don't miss out. We are thrilled to give regional students the chance to experience Shakespeare in a practical and immersive format and encourage all students to sign up for this free workshop, and to audition for the John Bell Scholarship."

Any full-time high school students who will be at least 16 by 31

December 2022 can audition for the John Bell Scholarship. The JBS is an once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to spend a week with some of the country's most respected actors, directors, and educators at renowned national theatre company Bell Shakespeare at their premises right on Sydney Harbour.

Dump for free back next weekend!

Have you just had a big clean out and have waste you need to dispose of? Do you need to have your own backyard blitz or clean out your home, shed or man cave? Why not do it for FREE!

The next Griffith City Council 'Dump for Free' weekend will be held on Saturday and Sunday 24 and 25 September at the Tharbogang Waste Management Centre and Yenda Waste Management Centre from 8am to 5pm.

Council's Waste Operations Manager, Mr John Roser said each year Council spends in excess of \$40,000 cleaning up waste from the roadside due to illegal dumping and the Dump for Free weekends are one way Council are trying to address the issue.

"The 'Dump for Free' day was an initiative of Council to address some of the illegal dumping throughout the LGA and to assist residents in the disposal of their Bulky Waste," he said.

"The weekends have proven to be a massive success with close to 1200 residents using the Tharbogang and Yenda service during the event held earlier this year.

"Residents who want to take advantage of the free entry at the Tharbogang and Yenda facilities can dispose of general domestic waste including garden rubbish, mixed recyclables and general waste and is capped at 2 standard loads per household. We will only accept 4 car tyres per load and no commercial or ag tyres will be accepted," added Mr Roser.

A standard load is the equivalent of a ute/car and trailer combo, or just

a ute or car load. It is important to note that no asbestos will be accepted over this weekend.

Griffith Mayor, Councillor Doug Curran is encouraging residents to take advantage of the Dump for Free weekend.

"Illegal dumping continues to be an issue for Griffith, and the Dump for Free weekends are one way Council is trying to address the problem," said Councillor Curran.

"Now is the perfect time to get rid of any excess rubbish you have been storing, have that Spring clean and dump it all for free!"


Remember to take advantage of the free Community Recycling Centre (CRC) located at the Tharbogang Waste Management Facility.

"The Community Recycling Centre is a permanent drop-off centre for common household problem wastes that can't be collected via council kerbside waste and recycling collection services," said Griffith Mayor, Councillor Doug Curran.

"Griffith and surrounds householders can drop off problem waste at the Tharbogang Waste Management Facility all year round, free of charge — take advantage of this great service at any time and help your local environment."

The CRC can accept paint, gas bottles, fire extinguishers, motor oils, other oil, car and household batteries, smoke detectors and fluro globes/tubes. The Centre can be accessed 7 days per week, 8am –5pm.





Griffith Regional Art Gallery set to inspire the next generation of artists with free drawing workshop

During this Spring School Holiday, Griffith Regional Art Gallery is offering two three-hour drawing workshops for young people aged 15-17 years.

The classes, being held on Friday 7 October and Saturday 8 October, will the taught by Anthony Cahill, artist and lecturer, currently teaching at the National Art School in Sydney.

He is also a finalist in the Dobell Drawing Prize #22, which is currently on display at the Griffith Regional Art Gallery.

Anthony Cahill has been exhibiting in commercial and public galleries in Australia and abroad since 1982. His work explores notions of landscape and human presence within a contemporary representation of landscape painting.

Images are derived initially through direct observation, his subjects are varied usually involving a figure in landscape, working without concern for formal boundaries of figuration and abstraction.

Anthony will provide participants with insight into basic mark-making through the practice of drawing. Participants will also gain a better understanding of drawing principles, observation of

a subject and techniques such as outlining and shading.

Gallery Coordinator, Ray Wholohan said it is the Gallery's absolute pleasure to host a drawing lecturer of Anthony's prominence to inspire and educate young artists of our region.

"We strongly encourage any young people between the ages of 15 and 17 who have an interest in drawing to register for this workshop," said Mr Wholohan.

"All skill levels are welcome - we are certain participants will not enjoy the workshops, but take home valuable lessons."

The workshops will take place at the Gallery 9am to 12pm on Friday 7 October and Saturday 8 October.

All materials will be supplied and although the workshops are free registration is essential. The Gallery asks that participants only register for one of the two workshops available.

Locality: Griffith

Reason for Proposal: To name the three Council owned car parks situated on Railway Street, Griffith. The three names selected are as follows:

- 1. Stevenson Carpark Bob Stevenson built Stevenson's Blue Metal Quarry in 1942 using a steam engine and crusher. The Quarry supplied blue metal to the then Wade Shire Council to develop roads all over the Riverina. In 1956 he established Ready Mix Concrete, the first company in the Riverina, which continues to this day as JJ Stevenson & Sons.
- 2. Eardley Carpark Fred Eardley arrived in the area in 1920. He opened the first haberdashery store in Banna Avenue.
- 3. Jasnos Carpark Eugene Jasnos was a well-known man to the community for his boot making and repairs. He owned his own shoe repair shop in Banna Lane for over 30 years before he retired. The family also owned the Griffith Tuck Shop where the first pool in Griffith was built.
