A temporary modular building to house the Renal Dialysis Unit has been delivered. It will need to be refurbished to suit our needs before it opens to the community and this will take several months, but to see things finally progressing in this way is encouraging.

As Chair of the Griffith Health Facilities Ltd Fundraising Committee it is my goal to do whatever I can to ensure the Griffith community and surrounding area get the best health care possible. I am excited at the prospect of a newly refurbished hospital, it is long overdue.

Residents invited to provide feedback on draft budget

Council is calling for public feedback on its draft budget after it was endorsed at last week's Council Meeting.

Council's Operational Plan for 2018-19, as well as its Delivery Program for the next four years has gone on public exhibition, with Griffith Mayor John Dal Broi inviting residents to attend a public information session on Thursday 26 April, 5.30pm at Griffith City Library.

Cr Dal Broi said, as with previous budgets, the documents detail the resources required over the next year to fund the wide range of services provided to the community.

"It outlines where we plan to invest in infrastructure, buildings and operational assets, as well as funding proposals for a range of projects," Cr Dal Broi said.

Cr Dal Broi is urging all community members to take a look and provide feedback.

"Our city is in an increasingly is serious about finding a \mid strong economic position and that's due to solid growth and expansion of local industries."

> "This budget is focused on continuing to work towards delivering the high level of services and programs resi

dents have come to expect and deserve.

"The aim is to capitalise on our strong financial position so we can invest in largescale infrastructure and capital projects in the coming years to enhance the lives of residents in Griffith and surrounding villages."

Cr Dal Broi encouraged community members to have their say on the budget.

"I urge everyone to have a look at the draft budget to see if it meets their aspirations or not," he said.

"See where your money is going and see what services you are getting. We encourage the community to take part in our community consultation on both these documents and help us shape the Budget and the Council Plan."

The 2018/19 Budget provides \$22.3million in capital works. Significant projects to be undertaken by Council in the next 12 months include:

- Enticknap Park makeover
- Memorial Park upgrade
- Yambil Street upgrade (part of the overall CBD project)
- Village Pathways for Hanwood, Yenda and Yoogali
- Southern Industrial Link -

Stage 2b Thorne Road and Kidman Way intersection (commenced)

• Skate Park relocation and renewal

"There is a lot of good work being carried out by Council staff to ensure we deliver the services and facilities required and expected by our community.

"The projects listed are just some of the large scale projects being undertaken or scheduled to be undertaken, however there is a lot more happening in the background," Councillor Dal Broi said. The draft Delivery Program, incorporating the draft Operational Plan can be viewed at Council Chambers, 1 Benerembah Street Griffith and the Griffith City Library or on Council's website at griffith.nsw.gov.au
