

‘Stones in his Pockets’ heading to Griffith



On Saturday 6 May at 7.30pm, Griffith Regional Theatre is set to host *Stones in his Pockets* - the hilarious and moving tale of a quiet Irish community turned upside down by the arrival of a Hollywood movie shoot. The multi award winning comedy by Marie Jones is a new production from touring powerhouse Critical Stages (Songs for the Fallen, 4000 Miles). The budding romance between a rich American actress and a local farmer, is played out against a background of growing friction between the locals hired as extras on the film and the Hollywood big shots. Manager Raina Savage said this show has played to acclaim all around the world – including a five year run in London’s West End. “It is an incredible two hander – which features absolutely virtuosic performances by Grant Cartwright (Thomas Murray and the Upside Down River) and Sean Hawkins (Best Actor: Sydney Theatre Award for Howie the Rookie) who play 15 characters between them!” she said. “It is incredible the way the two actors transform completely into each new character - playing everyone from the gormless extras dreaming of a future on the silver screen, to the angry young local, bitter about being rejected for a job on set, to the gorgeous Hollywood starlet.

Design Engineer (Permanent)
