

Getting started in the Integrated Waste Tracking Solution (IWTs)

The NSW Environment Protection Authority (EPA) has developed a new system for tracking movements of hazardous and high-risk wastes moving into, within and out of NSW.

The Integrated Waste Tracking Solution (IWTs) will replace WasteLocate and the Online Waste Tracking (OWT) system on **Wednesday 28 February 2024**. KPMG Origins will design, develop and operate the IWTs.

Activate your IWTs account

Current users of WasteLocate and OWT should register for the IWTs to meet their ongoing regulatory obligations. You can do this by clicking 'Register' on the [KPMG Origins IWTs homepage](#).

Create Consignments, Consignment Authorisations and Transport Certificates with a start date on or after 28 February 2024 in the IWTs

All Consignments, Consignment Authorisations and Transport Certificates with a start date on or after 28 February 2024 should be created in the IWTs. You can start setting these up in the IWTs from Tuesday 13 February 2024.

Please note that in the IWTs, 'Consignments' and 'Transport Certificates' are called 'Movements', and 'Consignment Authorisations' are called 'Movement Authorisations'.
