Australia Day Award recipients proudly celebrated

Griffith's Richard (Stephen) Mortlock has been named the Australia Day Citizen of the Year.

Mr Mortlock was presented with the top Australia Day honour on Wednesday, 26 January during the official ceremony, held at the Griffith Regional Theatre.

He received the accolade for his dedication, passion and commitment to protecting and supporting the residents of Griffith and surrounds for over 37 years while serving with the Griffith SES Unit.

Mr Mortlock retired from service in November 2021, marking an end to a stellar career which saw him involved in a wide range of events including car accidents and storms.

He was instrumental in helping protect properties during the 2012 flood event, working alongside his team sandbagging, repairing damage, transporting people to safety and cleaning up.

Griffith Mayor, Doug Curran congratulated

Mr Mortlock and the other worthy award recipients. He also acknowledged the 56 new citizens from 14 countries.

"On behalf of the Griffith community, I congratulate Stephen and all of the other worthy winners," Councillor Curran said.

"The Australia Day awards are an important way we can pay tribute to the commitment and dedication of individuals and groups across Griffith that go above and beyond to support our community."

New Griffith City Council meets for the first time

The new Griffith City Council met this week for the first time since the local government elections were held in early December 2021. The ordinary meeting was held on Tuesday, 25 January 2022 at 7pm in the Council Chambers.

The first item on the agenda was the swearing in of the newly-elected Councillors, Mayor Doug Curran, Glen Andreazza, Shari Blumer, Simon Croce, Jenny Ellis, Manjit Singh Lally, Melissa Marin, Anne Napoli, Christine Stead, Chris Sutton, Laurie Testoni and Dino Zappacosta. The election of Griffith's new Deputy Mayor followed, with Councillor Glen

Andreazza elected to hold the office until September 2022. The position of Deputy Mayor is elected by the members of the Council while the Mayor is popularly elected by the community every four years.

Councillor Andreazza said he looks forward to working with the Mayor and fellow Councillors to collaboratively bring new ideas and opportunities to Griffith.

"I am looking forward to working as part of a team to lead the city into an exciting future," he said.

Mayor Doug Curran congratulated Councillor Andreazza on his appointment.

"This is an exciting new period for our City and I look forward to working closely with all Councillors in the best interests of Griffith," Councillor Curran said.

Council General Manager Brett Stonestreet welcomed the new councillors.

"On behalf of all Griffith City Council staff, I'd like to formally welcome our new and returning Councillors and congratulate them on their elections," Mr Stonestreet said. "We look forward to delivering the wonderful projects already in progress, and working together to develop new opportunities for our community."

Other items on the agenda included the adoption of the 2020/21 Annual Financial Statements and the commencement of the review of Council Committee Structure for this term of Council.

To assist Council meet statutory requirements, increase knowledge and acquire skills necessary to perform their roles, all Councillors have participated in induction and professional development training over the past few weeks. The new Council will serve a reduced term (2 years and 9 months), rather than the normal four, due to the 12-month delay of local government elections.

Notice of Temporary Road Closure

Notice is hereby given under the Roads Act 1993, Section 122 for the temporary closing of:

Erskine Road between Griffin Avenue and Walla Avenue and Moses Street between Harward Road and Merrigal Street. Erskine Road and Moses Street will be closed from Monday 7 February 2022 until Saturday 30 April 2022 for sewer main works by BC Plumbing. Detours around the worksite and access for residents will be provided.

Toscan Road, Hanwood between Hanwood Avenue and Whiting Road will be closed on Friday 21 January 2022 from 9am until 10:30am for the replacing of an HV x arm on a power pole. Detours around the site will be provided.

Kooyoo Street between Banna Avenue and Banna Lane from Monday 22 November 2021 until Friday 27 May 2022 for the upgrading of Kooyoo Street by Griffith City Council. Access for local traffic and detours around the site will be provided. The pedestrian crossing will also remain open during the works.

Bromley Road and Butler Road between Bromley Road and Snaidero Road will remain closed until the end of June 2022 for the construction of the remaining section of Bromley Road and extension of Thorne Road between Bromley Road and Walla Avenue, Stage 5B of Griffith Southern Industrial Link Project. During the road closure motorists are advised to seek alternate routes.

Yambil Street between Ulong Street and Daines Street and Daines Street between Yambil Street and Canal Street will be closed to west bound traffic from Friday 24 December 2021 until Monday 17 January 2022 as part of the Stage 3 Southern Side Yambil Street construction works by Griffith City Council. Access for pedestrians and businesses will be provided. Detours around the worksite will be implemented for all other traffic.

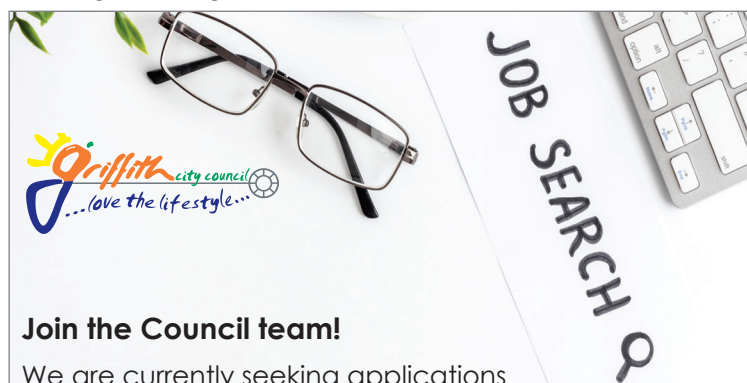
