- Griffith City Council is one 128 local councils in NSW.
- Last year 90,392 items were loaned from the Griffith City Library.
- 122,500 people attended the Griffith Regional Aquatic and Leisure Centre in 2021/22.
- 32,214 calls were made to Griffith City Council Customer Service
- More than 450 dogs came into the pound as well as 600 cats.
- 391,114 sheep were sold at the saleyards.
- 35,000 tonnes of waste was processed at the Waste Management Centre.
