



## Griffith's Spring Fest back in 2021

After a yearlong hiatus due to COVID-19, Griffith's flagship festival, Griffith Spring Fest is set to return on 10 – 24 October 2021 and will showcase everything Griffith has to offer.

This year will celebrate 30 years of the Griffith Garden Festival and 25 years of the Real Juice Company Citrus Sculptures.

Griffith City Council Events Coordinator, Georgina Horton said Real Juice Company have come back on board again this year as a major sponsor.

"The Citrus Sculpture application forms have gone out to participating community groups with many already having returned them, demonstrating how much everyone missed the Sculptures last year," said Ms Horton.

"We have had interest for some new sculptures which will make for a fantastic display, celebrating the 25th Anniversary of the Real Juice Company Citrus Sculptures."

Application forms are due in by the end of July as it is crucial to the planning of construction day and dismantle day to be held in a COVID safe way. Traditionally, around 800 locals meet in the early hours of Sunday morning to help build around 70 sculptures, which is one of the

key component event organisers are working on at the moment.

Although COVID-19 will have an impact on the way various events are run this year, Ms Horton says that it won't stop them delivering some of our favourite events.

"To ensure we are operating under the relevant COVID-19 restrictions, there will be change in the way we do things, but we will do our best to provide a fantastic event while following any instructions given by the NSW Government," said Ms Horton.

"We are excited to be hosting the 25th Anniversary of the Citrus Sculptures, and we know the community will support the plans we put in place to deliver this amazing event, keeping to the NSW Health guidelines."

Chairperson of the Festival of Gardens Working Group, Councillor Rina Mercuri said Griffith will be celebrating the 30th year of the Griffith Garden Festival, featuring new and returning gardens.

"A lot of work has been going on in the background to ensure we host a successful event and I am pleased to announce we will have gardening guru Costa Georgiadis to help

us celebrate - we can't wait to have him back in town," said Councillor Mercuri.

"After delivering an online festival in 2020, celebrating some of our wonderful garden owners, it is exciting to now be able to open up some of the region's most spectacular gardens in person again in 2021.

"We look forward to welcoming everyone to each garden to support the local charities and groups at each of the gardens," she added.

There are plans underway to deliver the LINX Launch Party again in the Griffith Visitor Information Centre Car Park, however specific details on this event are still being finalised to follow all NSW Health guidelines.

"We are working on a few scenarios on how we can deliver this event as we know it is a favourite amongst the locals, and visitors," said Councillor Mercuri.

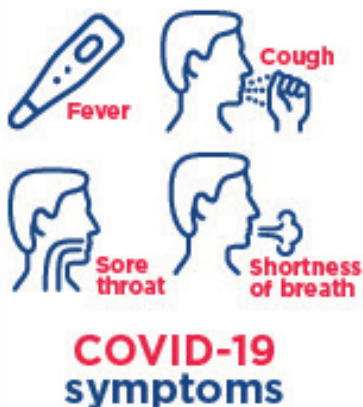
The workshop will look at some

## Nancy Blumer 'Fountain' turned orange for World Fragile X Day

The Nancy Blumer 'Fountain' was glowing orange last night, to acknowledge World Fragile X Day. Griffith joins over 200 illuminations worldwide - including Niagara Falls. Fragile X syndrome (FXS) is the most common inherited cause of autism and intellectual disabilities worldwide and at present, there is no cure.

Fragile X syndrome is a genetic disorder that occurs when a single gene on the X chromosome shuts down. This gene makes a protein needed for normal brain development. In FXS it does not work properly, the protein is not

made, and the brain does not develop as it should.

FXS can affect both sexes. Females generally have milder symptoms than males, although there is a lot of variation and no good way to predict this. While most males have intellectual impairment, only one-third of females have significant intellectual challenges. The rest have either normal IQ or learning disabilities. Math is often a particular challenge for females. Emotional and behavioral problems are common in both sexes.

## Check your Electoral Roll details

The 2021 Local Government Elections are being held Saturday 4 September 2021.

Voting is compulsory in Australia and enables you to say who you choose to represent you in federal, State and local governments. You only need to enrol once with the Australian Electoral Commission to vote for all three levels of government.

If you are not sure whether you are enrolled to vote, you can check your enrolment details online. You can also update your details, find out if there's an election being held near you, and sign up to our

free election reminder service to receive SMS or email reminders for when you have to vote at an election.

Griffith Local Government Area residents are required to vote for 11 Councillors and 1 Mayor for the next term, which is a 3 year term.

It is important that your details are up to date on the Electoral Roll. If you have not enrolled to vote, you are required to register.

## COVID-19 restrictions – what restrictions apply in regional NSW?

### Do not travel to Greater Sydney areas without a reasonable excuse

If you live in regional and rural areas, you must not enter Greater Sydney including the Blue Mountains, Central Coast, Wollongong and Shellharbour local government areas unless you have a reasonable excuse.

If you enter these areas for any reason, stay at home rules will also apply to you for 14 days after you were last in any of these areas.

### When to wear a face mask

There are rules for wearing a fitted face covering (face mask):

- when you are travelling in a vehicle (car) with a person you do not live with (see the guidance on carpooling)
  - in non-residential indoor areas
  - in airports and on commercial domestic flights.
  - you must wear a face mask in NSW when using public transport
- You do not need to wear a face mask when you are:
- in your home on your own

- in your home with other people you live with, except if someone in your household is self-isolating

- travelling in a vehicle (car) by yourself or with other people you live with.

### Face Mask Exemptions

The public health order includes a number of lawful reasons for not wearing a mask.

You are not required to wear a mask if you have a physical or mental health illness or condition, or disability, that makes wearing a mask unsuitable. For example, if you have a skin condition, an intellectual disability, autism or trauma, you are not required to wear a mask.

- Masks should not be worn by toddlers under 2 years of age and babies, as they are a choking and suffocation risk.

- Children 12 years and under are exempt but are encouraged to wear masks.

### Household Visitors

Up to 5 visitors may visit another household at any one time. The total number of visitors includes adults and children. A member of the hosting household is not counted as a visitor.

There is no daily limit to visitors to your home, so long as you do not have more than 5 visitors at any one time.

An overnight stay as part of a visit to someone's house is allowed.

As a host, it is your responsibility to ensure that no more than 5 people visit your household at any one time.

As a visitor, it is your responsibility to ensure that you do not visit a residence if there are more than 5 people there.

### Weddings, funerals and memorial services

Dancing is allowed at weddings for the bridal party only (no more than 20 people).

Funerals and memorial services are permitted. Funerals and memorial services outside of Greater Sydney are permitted with a maximum of 1 person per 4 square metres of space on the premises.

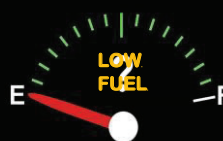
