Griffith sport lovers are in for a treat this weekend with a range of top class events added to the usual fixtures.

The ACT Brumbies and NSW Waratahs will battle it out in a pre-season trial at the Exies Oval on Saturday, 4 February 2023 from 4pm. The historic game in Griffith will be the first time the Brumbies have played at Exies Sports Club, the trial against the Waratahs doubling as Stephen Larkham's side's first look at their round one opposition, with Scott Fava taking charge of his first game as Super W head coach against the South Australian Black Falcons.

For those who prefer their sport poolside, the Speedo Sprint and Southern Inland Swimming Association Championships, attracting swimmers from as far as Wagga and Tumut, will take place on Saturday, 4 February and Sunday, 5 February at the Griffith Regional Aquatic Leisure Centre.

The Griffith Regional Sports Centre will also be a hive of activity, with the Little Athletics Region 4 Championships. Around 850 athletes from 32 clubs will compete from East and Western Riverina, Mid-South Coast and South Coast Highlands. The first two place-getters in each event will progress to State competition.

Basketball fans won't miss out either when the region's best representative junior players and officials come together on Saturday 4 February for a Gala Day in preparation for the first round of Basketball NSW Western Junior League for 2023. Athletes from Leeton, Narrandera and West Wyalong are expected to attend.

Griffith City Council Mayor, Doug Curran said: "It is great to see Griffith recognised as a place to hold significant sporting events such as these.

"The Brumbies Rugby Roadshow is a wonderful opportunity for our community, including school children to be exposed to elite athletes," he said.

"It's going to be a massive weekend in Griffith. Accommodation has been booked out for weeks. Having so many people visit for these events not only helps raise the profile of Griffith but boosts our economy.

"Accommodation, clubs, pubs, restaurants and retailers are all set to benefit. I want to welcome all of the visiting competitors and wish everyone the very best for a top weekend of sport," he added.

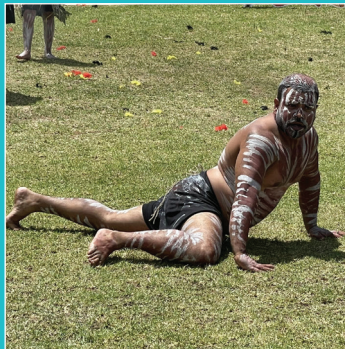

## Country Education Fund awards grants to local students

Griffith Mayor, Councillor Doug Curran attended the Country Education Foundation Griffith's tertiary scholarship presentation last week.

The event, held on Wednesday 25 January at the Yenda Producers, saw more than \$30,000 awarded to local students to assist with costs associated with their tertiary education.

Twelve students were selected for the grant which is given directly to course related goods and service providers, ensuring the money goes where it is needed most.

Events such as Curry and Jam assist in raising money for the Foundation, which was established to give a helping hand to local youth and support a diverse range of education and career pursuits including apprenticeships, traineeships, cadetships, degrees, diplomas and certificate level studies or entry careers.

Since its inception, the Country Education Foundation has distributed more than \$200,000 and has helped more than 70 local students.

Councillor Curran said he is certain all the recipients have a

bright future ahead of them. "It is important to support students whilst they study and encourage them to return home to Griffith to help further grow our community," Councillor Curran said.

"I look forward to the future for you all and welcoming you back into the Griffith workforce."

Students selected are studying a range of degrees including Radiation Science, Medical Studies, Engineering, Commerce, Construction Project Management, Education, Vision Science, Business Studies and Occupational Therapy.

Griffith Regional Art Gallery will celebrate 40 years with the launch the 2023 exhibition program and a very special guest.

The official launch will take place at the Gallery on Friday, 10 February 2023 at 6pm. The event will include a full rundown on all upcoming exhibitions for the year, as well as public programs including workshops and art classes.

Art Gallery Manager, Marg Andreazza said, "We are excited to announce that we will be welcoming artist Alison Mitchell to our launch. Alison's exhibition *Unlemon: A Meandering tale of Citrus* is currently on exhibition at the Gallery, so we are delighted she can join us to talk about her beautiful artworks."

"This year marks a milestone in the history of the Gallery as we celebrate its 40th birthday. To commemorate this, we will be curating an exhibition of artworks, historical information and other ephemera highlighting the Gallery's 40 year history. This event, taking place in September, will be a highlight of our 2023 program," Mrs Andreazza said.

Art Gallery Coordinator, Ray Wholohan said, "Our 2023 program will focus on exhibitions and projects that engage artists based in the Riverina or how they have practiced art making the Riverina and themes that are relevant to our diverse community. Our Public Programs Officer, Melanie Toscan has been busy planning a number of engaging public programs and workshops, art talks, after school kids' art classes and holiday programs

throughout this year."

The Gallery is also pleased to announce the continued partnership with local winery Dee Vine Estate.

"We thank Dee Vine Estate for again coming on board to supply our patrons with their fine wines for our events, and encourage everyone to come and join us on Friday, 10 February," Mrs Andreazza said. The current Exhibition *Unlemon: a Meandering Tale of Citrus* is an exhibition of over 40 still-life oil paintings that unfolds the story of citrus. From its origins approximately 20 million years ago on the Gondwana supercontinent, through its trade routes from China and Persia to the Mediterranean and the Americas, and on to its uses in medicine and culinary practices, the humble citrus is elevated in this exquisite exhibition.

Alison Mitchell will also give an artist talk and demonstration on Saturday, 11 February at 11.30am. This is likely to be a very popular event and spots are limited so the Gallery advises to register for the event to avoid disappointment.

## Notice of Public Exhibition of a Planning Proposal (Amendment to the Griffith Local Environmental Plan 2014) (Planning Proposal PP-2022-3697)

The purpose of the planning proposal is to make general amendments to the Griffith Local Environmental Plan 2014 inline with Council Strategies and State legislation, including:

- Development controls for secondary dwellings in rural zones
- Permitting Artisan food and drink industry in the RU1, RU4 and E1 zones
- Permitting neighbourhood supermarkets in the R1 and R3 zones

The Planning Proposal also proposes the rezoning of several portions of land identified for rezoning in the Griffith Large Lot Supply and Demand Analysis and Strategy, the Griffith Housing Strategy and the Griffith Local Strategic Planning Statement.

At the Griffith City Council Ordinary Meeting held on 24 January 2023, Council resolved to place Planning Proposal – PP 2022-3697 on public exhibition for a period of 28 days and seek public submissions.

### Notice of Temporary Road Closures

Notice is hereby given under Roads Act 1993, Section 122 for the temporary closing of the following roads:

**Walla Avenue between Mansell Road and Bromley Road and Thorne Road between Walla Avenue and Murrumbidgee Avenue will remain closed until Friday 30 June 2023, with Walla Ave anticipated to be opening to traffic by end of June 2023.** Walla Avenue and Thorne Road will be closed for the Construction of Stage 5b, 5a and 4b of the Great Southern Industrial Link Project by Griffith City Council. Detours around the site and access for heavy vehicles will be provided.
