Funding for community centre

Griffith Mayor John Dal Broi has welcomed the announcement of \$3.65 million in NSW Government funding to build new, modern Griffith Youth and Community Centre. The new home will bring local social services and mental health and wellbeing programs together under one roof and also be equipped to host community events, skills and training sessions, meetings and recreational activities. Mayor John Dal Broi said he was delighted with the funding from the NSW Government. "This is something the community has been working for many years," Cr Dal Broi said. "The current building and location isn't ideal. It doesn't meet the needs of our growing city. "This new one will provide facilities for community groups that want to deliver

their services in a permanent location. I am thrilled with this announcement." Member for Murray Austin Evans made the announcement on Wednesday. "The current fibro building has served the community but the new facility on Olympic Street, featuring offices, meeting rooms, a performance space, storage and car parking, will deliver a better level of service," Mr Evans said. "The Griffith Youth and Community Centre, which will have an earth covered shelter design inspired by Parliament House in Canberra, will be a focal point for community interaction while its new name reflects our renewed commitment to young people. "By funding this project we are sending a clear message that the services the community expect and deserve, we will deliver and they are here to stay. "We know the current drought is directly

and indirectly affecting the mental health of people of all ages across the regions and while we are providing economic relief, we also have to address issues around mental wellbeing." Griffith Community Centre Inc Manager Barbara Penninga said after eight years of planning, meetings and consultations with all levels of government, we are delighted to receive this announcement. "We are absolutely sure that the people of Griffith will see the new centre as a valuable asset, offering much needed support and services to our community. And a big thank you to Austin Evans, who chose to support our quest and worked hard to secure this funding," Ms Penninga said. Funding for the Griffith Youth and Community Centre has been secured from the NSW Government's Regional Communities Development Fund.

Australia Day free pool entry

Local families can enjoy the Griffith Regional Aquatic Leisure Centre (GRALC) for free this Australia Day. At its meeting on Tuesday night Griffith City Council resolved, as a one-off instance, to reflect the ongoing hot weather, to provide free entry into the pool area on Saturday only. The facility's swimming pool area will open to the public for free this Saturday, 26 January 2019, from 8am to 6pm. GRALC will also be open on Sunday 10am to 5pm and on the public holiday Monday 9am to 6pm, with the usual entry fee applying. Griffith Mayor Councillor John Dal Broi said he was happy that families would be able to cool down for free on Saturday. "This decision has been taken in light of the extremely high

temperatures and because it's Australia Day we thought it would be a good thing for the community," Cr Dal Broi said. "Where possible Griffith City Council will try and accommodate the needs of our community. Council is listening to what the community wants. We won't always be able to, but if we can we will certainly try." Entry will be free into the pool area only on Saturday which, according to the Bureau of Meteorology, is forecast to reach 43 degrees in Griffith. Free entry does not include the gym area. For more information please contact GRALC on 6962 8228. Council reminds residents that is important to be prepared in the heat. As recommended by NSW Health the key messages

- from their NSW Beat the Heat campaign are;
- Drink plenty of water
 - Minimise physical activity
 - Check on elderly friends, neighbours and relatives, especially if they live alone
 - If you have an air-conditioner, make sure it is working before you need it
 - If you don't have air-conditioning, spend time in a cool place like a library, shopping centre or cinema.
 - Avoid being outdoors between 11 am and 5 pm
 - Avoid alcoholic, hot or sugary drinks
 - Take cool showers or baths
 - Wear light coloured, loose fitting clothes made from natural fibres like cotton
 - Cool your house by shading windows, shutting curtains and, if it's safe to do so opening windows at night to let in cool air.
