

Your Councillors Keeping You Up to Date

This week we hear from Councillor Dino Zappacosta, Deputy Mayor

I cannot start this column without firstly mentioning how shocked and sorry we are over our General Manager, Brett Stonestreet's unfortunate incident and hope it won't be too long before he is back on deck. Our thoughts go out to Brett, Vicki and family.

Our Council staff have rallied together to make sure Council continues to function as Brett would like it to perform. Our Mayor, John Dal Broi and our Acting General Manager, Max Turner, and Senior Staff have had extra responsibilities placed on their shoulders. They all need to be commended on how they stepped up to the mark.

I now draw everyone's attention to a few matters that may be of interest. Firstly, Council is seeking interested person to serve on Council's new "Friends of Groups". These groups have been established for the Griffith Regional Theatre, Art Gallery, Library, and Griffith Regional Aquatic & Leisure Centre and Sports Stadium. These groups will meet as regularly as required by the Facility Managers and the members themselves. The whole idea is to allow free-flowing conversations on the operations of the various facilities. The feedback, suggestions, comments both positive or negative, will be of great assistance in the making sure our Council provides what the Community needs or expects.

Please feel free to contact the Council offices, or facility managers, to nominate. There will be no limit to numbers nominating. All will be welcome. We want your input!

Council also has also established a number of "Working Groups" who operate on similar lines to Friends of Groups but with some



minor formalities. "Working Groups" have been formed for Build More Dams; Pioneer Park; Festival of Gardens; Australia Day and the Senior Citizens Centre and have a specific aim or job and allow their members to "get on with the job". I chair the "Build More Dams Working Group" and would certainly welcome more members to the committee.

Secondly, I would like to raise the awareness of residents who maintain large corner block nature strips next to their property as there is a subsidy to offset the water charges for watering the extra-large nature strip reserve. Now is the time of the year to apply for the charge. To find out if you are eligible for a subsidy, contacting the Council Administration Office and Council staff will work out if your circumstances comply.

Thirdly, the "Tip for Free" conducted last weekend was an outstanding success. The Tharbogang Landfill site was heavily utilised, with 580 vehicles attending Saturday and 554 vehicles attending Sunday. The Yenda Landfill site was also busy with 336 vehicles attending. Illegal rubbish dumping on nature strips and in reserves continues to be a problem for Council and weekends such as this provide an alternative to dumping illegally.

Finally, with Easter approaching quickly, may I wish everyone a happy, safe and enjoyable Easter.
