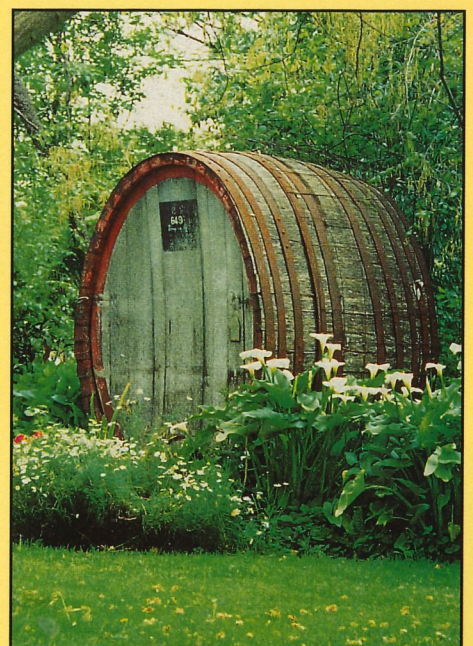
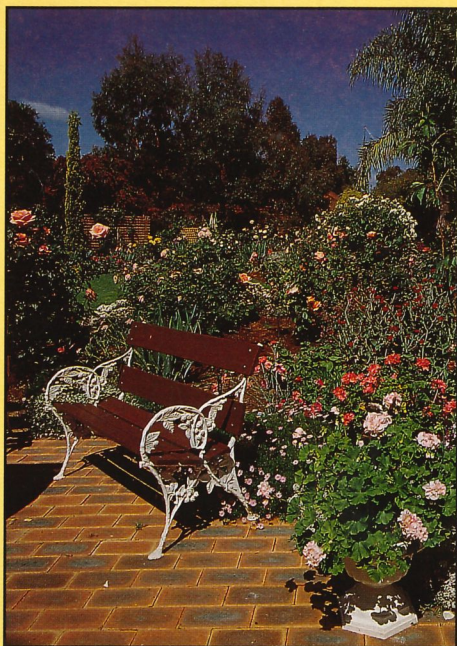

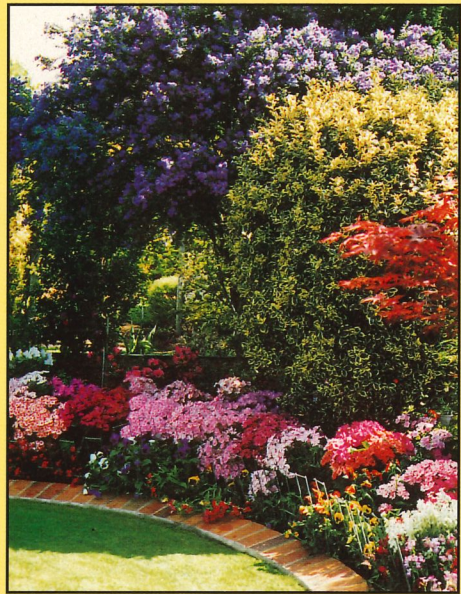
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Griffith Festival of Gardens

Take the time to enjoy the many other aspects that makes a visit to Griffith special.

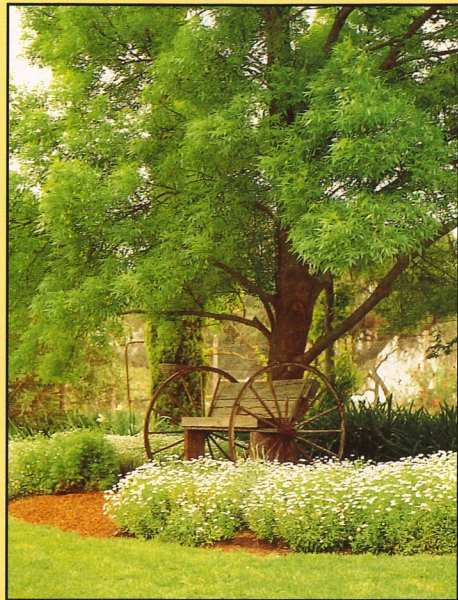

6 New Gardens

This year's 12 Festival gardens offer visitors a delightful mixture of old favourites and new. Old or new, each garden is sure to delight and provide you with a dazzling mixture of colour, sights and perfumes. The Festival gardens are open from 9.30am to 5.00pm. Entry prices are \$2.00 for entry to a single garden and \$15.00 for entry to all the gardens. Morning and afternoon teas \$3.00, lunch \$5.00.

Bruce & Julie Armstrong: "Corynnia Station", Carrathool. A large garden of contrasts with formal areas highlighted by terra-cotta statuary through to cottage style, complimented by "in the rough" Australian bush furniture. Style and simplicity are features with cool colours favoured. Hardy species are used in massed plantings with many new developments over the past year. Supporting: Goolgowi Public School

Myles & Elizabeth Bunn: "Jeanella", Goolgowi. The original garden has grown to two acres and features a framework of deciduous trees. Go one way and you are in a lush native garden - in another, beds are filled with David Austin roses, cottage plants and climbing roses. Other features include a white garden, orchard walk and a raised vegetable patch formed by old railway sleepers. Supporting: Cancer Patients Assistance Society

Nora & Bruno Ceccato: Farm 2380 Clark Rd. Yoogali. A 3/4 acre garden set amidst an orange grove. Nora's dream was a garden where she could work with plants and watch the results. Now there's over 300 rose bushes, numerous trees, shrubs - both native and exotic including azaleas, camellias and gardenias. There are many perennials, ground covers, irises, bulbs and annuals. Vincent & Jane Cercone: Farm 311 Prior Rd. Bilbul. This easy care garden, with expansive lawns, features mainly native gums and smaller plantings. Newer plantings compliment many of the original 60 year old trees. A feature of this garden is that the owners have been able to create a natural bush setting to compliment the more formal garden beds which feature a variety of roses. Tarcisio & Domitilla Colla: 9 Lawford Cres. Griffith. The colourful garden, featuring many annuals has won 9 prizes in garden competitions. The initial design by landscape artist Kevin Sheridan included the use of local rock. This design has been extended with many exotic shrubs, bulbs and seedlings resulting in a magnificent kaleidoscope of colour, texture and variation. Supporting: Scalabrini Village

Dennis & Dianne Diehm: 624 Overs Rd. Griffith. A 4 acre open plan garden, where natives and exotics blend together. Designed with children in mind and a place of enjoyment for the owners. The man-made creek and pond gives the effect of having been part of the original landscape. A walk through native area is a haven for birds. Orchids are grown in the shade and glasshouses. Supporting: Griffith Branch Asthma Foundation

June & Keith Devery: 39 Curtin Street, Griffith. The "secret" garden hidden behind the house has evolved over many years through a labour of love and deep interest in gardening. An Aladdins cave, jam packed full of almost every conceivable type of flower, tree, shrub and plant. Meandering paths criss cross this delightful setting with each turn offering something new, colourful and different. Supporting: Community Leisure Garden

Tori Horder & Lawrence Salvestrin: "Davit Farm", Wodgelli. Several acres of parkland with formal rose beds, perennials, walks and alleys help to create a peaceful ambience. New areas are under creative development featuring innovative design ideas. Sit quietly in the gazebo or on one of the many stoneware seats and benches dotted around this lovely tranquil garden. Supporting: St. Patrick's School

Pat & John Jones: "Yambiana" Yenda. Spacious lawns wind around curving garden beds harbouring stands of tall timber which give shelter and provide magnificent vistas. Background plantings, from exotics to natives, provide rich foliage and flower colour. The water tank, draped in climbing roses and the wine cask are features of this delightful, peaceful garden. Supporting: M.S. Society

Libby & Greg McWilliam: Temora Road, Yenda. Established 45 years ago by Greg's mother Elva the garden has grown in stages. The mature trees form the boundary to the garden as well as being prominent features. Near the house the garden is open and creates areas of different appeal. New plantings have been undertaken to replace older areas yet, the overall plan and style has been retained. Supporting: Griffith Brownies

Bruno & Joy Plos: 5 Maegraith Pl. Somerton Park. Belle Amour is a prize winning garden established in 1987. A haven for all seasons, with natives, conifers, maples, exotics and rare perennials. Arbours and arches are covered in David Austin roses, a lace iron bridge spans the pond. The gazebo invites you to enjoy the vista and tranquillity. New additions are tillandsias on mallee timber. Supporting: Griffith Lions Club

Shirley & Brian Walleit: "Karbil" Watkins Ave. Griffith. The garden started as trees and lawn and has been developed with curving beds and plantings. Extensive use of perennials, shrubs and trees gives colour and texture throughout the year. The large lawn sits in perfect harmony with the historic homestead. Wide variety of plantings from roses, rhododendrons, camellias through to bulbs. Supporting: Cancer Patients Assistance Society

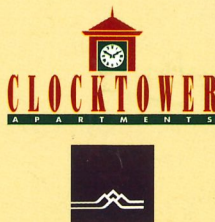
~ The Nurseries of Griffith ~
