Celebrate World Wetlands Day



Griffith City Council will mark World Wetlands Day by reminding locals about the hidden gem that is Campbell's Wetland.

World Wetlands Day is celebrated internationally each year, marking the anniversary of the signing of the Convention on Wetlands of International Importance (Ramsar Convention) in Ramsar, Iran, on 2 February 1971.

This year, the international theme of World Wetlands Day is 'wetlands and biodiversity', raising awareness of the vital services wetlands provide and their importance as habitat to a diverse range of plants and animals, many of which are rare or threatened.

Campbell's Wetland is located approximately 6 km's North of Griffith and is 27.3 hectares in size, sitting on the eastern side of Lake Wyangan.

Council's Principal Officer Environment, David Kellett, said Campbell's Wetland was one of the best kept secrets in the Griffith City Council area. "Campbell's is a natural ephemeral wetland, meaning that it would usually hold water after heavy rain and flooding and periodically dry up," Mr Kellett said.

"However, in recent years Campbell's Wetland has been allocated environmental water providing a more permanent habitat for waterbirds to take refuge through our harsh summers.

"While not currently recognised under the Ramsar convention as a wetland of international significance, Campbell's has been recognised as an Important Bird Area (IBA) and helps support the mosaic of wetlands of inland NSW, particularly within the broader Riverina Region and locally within the MIA, as being a site offering refuge during drought years for migratory and other bird species."

Several Threatened Species have been recorded at Campbell's Wetland including the Australasian Bittern and the Southern Bell Frog. Five bird species have been recorded at Campbell's that are covered by the Japan-Australia Migratory Bird Agreement (JAMBA) and the China-Australia Migratory Bird Agreement (CAMBA) and over 53 waterbird species have been recorded.

Mr Kellett said the best time to visit Campbell's Wetland is early morning or late afternoon when the birds are more active.

"Just remember to wear long pants and enclosed footwear, broad brimmed hat, sunglasses and sunscreen, and most importantly, be patient, waterbirds at times are very mobile - and please don't litter," he said.

Yoogali, GPSO is able to offer a range of facilities including a gym, indoor pool, futsal and indoor netball court, and respite, to cater for all types of disabilities. The Team at GPSO teaches clients a range of new skills including trades and other skills to enter the workforce.

Robert is well deserving of this honour and is just one example of a volunteer working to improve the lives of our community members. Each year I am able to acknowledge the work of community members through the Local Hero award. This year I have recognised an extraordinary woman, Michelle Bordignon.

Michele's accomplishments are too many to list. She received the Citizen of the Year Award in 2014 and in the years since, she has not slowed down!

Michelle has started a Facebook group titled 'Griffith Helping Hands' where she coordinates the donation of goods and ensures they are given to those in need. In the last year alone she has collected

hampers, handbags, pantry items, furniture, white goods, clothing, toiletries and other essentials. Michelle truly embodies what the Local Hero award stands for.

I would like to congratulate all our other winners and nominees. It is important to show those within our community gratitude for all they do to improve our lives. To those who prepared nominations, I thank you for taking the time to share your stories of these deserving locals.
