Let's make healthy normal

Council has joined forces with Murrumbidgee Local Health District (MLHD) to encourage residents to 'make healthy normal'. With over half of the adults in NSW and more than 60 percent in Murrumbidgee overweight or obese, we are living in an environment where being overweight has become 'normal'. Not only is overweight and obesity associated with a wide range of chronic health conditions including type 2 diabetes, cardiovascular diseases and cancer, it is currently costing the NSW Government \$19 billion per year. Make Healthy Normal works on the principle that small changes to how we live our lives can make a big difference to our overall health. By gradually increasing the number of healthy choices we make every day, we will be

healthier, and have increased quality of life and reduced risk of chronic disease. Council's Community Development Coordinator, Peta Dummett, is delighted to be working in collaboration with MLHD to encourage residents to make a change. "Small changes to your lifestyle can make a big difference. Regular physical activity helps you maintain good health and manage your weight and it also makes you feel happier, which is good for your overall mental health," Ms Dummett said. As part of the Make Healthy Normal Campaign partnership Ms Dummett and MLHD Health Promotion Coordinator Judy Callinan placed stickers around City Park last week. The stickers have been positioned along the footpath at 200-metre intervals and pro-

vide a visual of how many kilojoules you have burnt over the 1kms marked out. Ms Dummett is encouraging residents to take the first small step towards a healthier normal by getting active. "As the weather starts to warm up I urge residents to get out and about and enjoy our parks and open spaces," she said. "Even if you start by simply getting up from your desk at lunchtime and walking around the block with a colleague, or take your lunch break outside. "Why not ask your colleagues to have a 'walk and talk' meeting rather than sitting at a desk? Mayor John Dal Broi said he was happy Council could help spread the Make Health Normal Campaign message. Record-breaking saleyards

The Griffith Saleyards is having a record-breaking run, with the Council facility currently holding three national titles.

On Friday 22 August, 2018 Prime Lambs reached a new national record of \$318, where multiple pens broke the previous record of \$305.20 made at Wagga earlier in that same week. New season lambs also broke records, with a pen of 31 new

season suckers sold for \$260. Meanwhile merino lambs sold for \$253.

Mayor John Dal Broi commended the vendors involved. "I know that they put a lot of time and money into their lambs. What I'm also impressed about is the area that we are currently drawing from," Cr Dal Broi said. "We are seeing them come from all over which is good news for Griffith.

The whole city benefits because it means that while the husbands are busy at the sales their wives are often enjoying our shops and our restaurants and cafes."


Mayor Dal Broi congratulated staff at the Griffith Saleyards for their efforts.
