# **Australia Day Ambassador** announced for 2018

Griffith City Council will be welcoming Chelsea Bonner, founder of Bella Models and daughter of Australian model Nola Clark and well known actor, Tony Bonner to Griffith as part of the Australia Day celebrations on January 26.

Chelsea started her career as a junior agent when she was just a teen, moving on to work for a top model agency in Melbourne and managing creative agencies in Sydney and Melbourne. Chelsea has launched and guided the careers of some of Australia's most well-known fashion and advertising photographers, hair and makeup artists and stylists throughout the 90s.

In 2002 Chelsea founded Bella Models, an agency focused on health and changing the perception of size and beauty, with the goal of redefining boundaries of fashion and model sizes. BELLA is now known all over the world and her models have appeared on 'World First' covers and in the fashion editorials of Sports Illustrated, Vogue, ELLE, Cosmopolitan and Marie Claire. In 2013 Chelsea launched the talent division of her business which represents young actors, fitness and advertising entities and in 2015 she launched her full service agency, BELLA Management.

Chelsea said "I've long been a passionate advocate for a more realistic portrayal of women in the media. It gives me enormous satisfaction to see these gorgeous women starting to get the appreciation they deserve."

Chairperson of the Australia Day Working Party, Councillor Christine Stead welcomed the announcement and said it is extremely exciting to have such a high profile and passionate Ambassador.

"We are thrilled to welcome someone of this caliber, Chelsea Bonner to be our official ambassador at our 2018 Australia Day celebrations," said Councillor Stead.

"Chelsea is dedicated to changing how women are perceived which can be seen through her incredible career," said Councillor Stead.

"In addition to BELLA Management, Chelsea is set to launch her book in 2019 part memoir, part manifesto, the book will show what she has had to go through in order to build her business and turn her life around. Chelsea is inspirational, passionate and she is paving the way for future generations. We are so excited to be able to have her in Griffith this year."

Griffith's Australia Day Celebrations will kick off with the annual Australia Day Breakfast at Griffith Pioneer Park Museum, followed by the Australia Day Awards and Citizenship Ceremony at Griffith Regional Theatre from 9.30am.
